



SUPER STICKS

Do your children love playing with sticks?

My eldest has always been fascinated with sticks and continues to amass a collection of sticks by our front door of different shapes and sizes, all of which in his eyes are "good sticks". We now have a one-in, one-out policy and if I dispose of any, he always seems to notice

What's so good about a stick?

The stick is perhaps one of the oldest toys and the starting point for endless activities for generations of children all over the world. Children can poke and drag sticks, make interesting patterns in mud, sand, or leaves, build with sticks bat balls or make music with them. When children pretend with sticks, they cultivate their creativity. With a bit of imagination, the humble stick can be an endless source of make-believe fun. A stick can be a fishing rod, a sword to fight off trolls in the woods, a magic wand to cast spells or a broomstick to transport

you to another world. Playing with sticks ignites children's imagination and also has physical benefits. Branches and large sticks build muscles as children drag, manipulate or carry them outdoors. Teamwork happens when a stick is too large for just one child to move and children develop their communication and social skills as they engage their peers to help them.

Sticks may be the oldest toy, and they're possibly one of the best too. So many play activities can start with a stick. Here are a few ideas...

Stick Play

Sticks give children the freedom to invent and discover, and make great building materials. They can make a bridge to hold up a toy, or a den for a teddy. See how high you can build a stick tower by layering sticks on top of one another.

Add some toy people or animals and you have a whole new miniature world for adventures.

Adventure sticks

When it comes to a simple activity that keeps children busy, active and having fun, scavenger hunts are always popular and can be easily be adapted for different ages.

In its simplest form you can hide a toy or some well wrapped pieces of a snack a few metres away then use sticks to mark the way to the treasure. Or lay a 'secret' trail to lead a group of older children through a woodland or along a path. Before you start, go over some ground rules like making sure the children stay together.



Make stick animals, people, faces and sculptures

While much can be done with sticks on their own, you can do even more by adding a few simple materials. Use some clay and natural objects to



make creatures or simply create your own sculpture. Clay easily adheres to the side of a tree and we love making clay faces in the wood for people to find. Just place a dollop of soft clay or mud onto the side of a tree and use sticks, moss and leaves to create a face. You could also try your hand at some land art by arranging sticks and any other natural materials in a pattern on the ground.

Wind streamer

Once your child has found a "good stick" it's easy to make a wind streamer. Find old scraps of material (silky textures work well) or ribbons. Wrap the material around the stick and tie a knot. You don't have to wait for a breezy afternoon, as once your little one starts to move, the material will stream out behind them as they run, skip, hop and jump.

Make some noise

Our three boys love drumming with sticks: on the side of old trees, metal fences or anything that makes a good noise. You can also make some noise by creating a rattle. Find a Y-shaped stick and paint or wrap it with coloured wool. Wrap some thin wire on the top, and thread on some beads, bells, bottle tops, or anything that makes some noise.

Safety with sticks

As always caution needs to be taken with stick play to keep everyone safe and look after the world around us. Sticks are part of the natural world, providing food and shelter for birds and animals, so always collect them with care.

General safety guidelines:

- Take great care when running with sticks
- Don't point sticks at faces
- Never wield a stick at people or animals
- Watch out for splinters
- When throwing sticks, make sure everyone is well out of the way
- Wash hands once you have finished your adventures/activities

AUTUMN IS ON ITS WAY! It's a great time to get outside, take in the changing colours, find some "good" sticks and get creative!



SWEET CHILD OF MINE What to do about our kids' sugar intake?

What is sugar and why does it matter?

Sugar is the most simple form of carbohydrate and the name given to sweet foods, or food molecules that break down into glucose. Your body and brain need some glucose to function, and sugars are found naturally in foods such as honey and fruit, and they are released when starchy foods are digested. High sugar intakes however have been linked to inflammation, weight gain and tooth decay.

Sugar is added to many processed foods as a preservative, bulking agent or flavour enhancer. Added or 'free sugars', such as honey and unsweetened fruit juice are the type of sugar that we need to limit. You can find them by reading the ingredient list on packaged and prepared foods (see the box below for details).

Watch out for added sugar in packaged foods, also called:

- honey, molasses, agave nectar, syrup, maple syrup, rice syrup, corn syrup and high fructose corn syrup
- fruit juice, evaporated or concentrated cane/ fruit juice
- any word ending in "ose" such as: sucrose, glucose, fructose, dextrose, galactose or maltose

So what do I do?

You can check for added or free sugar by looking at the ingredient list on packed foods. If any of the above words are listed in the first few ingredients it is a high sugar food. You can figure out how much naturally occurring and added sugars are in a food by looking at the

nutritional information on the food label. It will tell you how many grams (g) of sugar are in a food. Remember 4g of sugar equals about 1 tsp – so the example below, which has 34g of sugar, contains 8 ½ tsp of sugar!



There is no guideline limit for children under the age of 4, but it's recommended they avoid sweet drinks (like fruit juice) and foods with added sugar.

Many of us could reduce our added sugar intake and feel better but sweet treats are around us everywhere! We've developed a delicious, lower sugar chocolate cake recipe. The black beans add a little hidden fibre and nutrition. Shhhhh!!!



CHOCOLATE BUNS with a (Healthy) Twist

For the past year I've been trying to come up with a lower sugar bun recipe for my kids...ideally with added hidden nutrition The kids and I have tried various low sugar recipes, with varving success. We've tried substituting sugar for mashed bananas and tried to blend in all sorts of vegetables; carrot. courgettes, and even peas and broccoli too! Admittedly some of the cakes were revolting.... Especially the one with pureed pea icing....yuck!

Finally, we have a winner. This healthier bun recipe actually works. I love them because they're lower in sugar and have added fibre, protein and healthy fats (from the black beans and avocado) and the kids love them because they are chocolate flavoured and baked in pretty cupcake papers. It's a win win!

Ingredients:

230g Sugar (about 50% less than most cupcake recipes)

3 eggs

190ml rapeseed oil 2tsp vanilla extract 1 400g tin black beans

1 ripe avocado 230g plain flour

½ tsp salt

1 tsp cinnamon powder
1 tsp baking powder
1 tsp bicarbonate of soda
70g cocoa powder

Method:

- Preheat the oven to 180°C.
- Drain and rinse the black beans well.
- Puree the black beans until completely smooth.
- Add the flesh of the avocado and puree until smooth.
- Blend in the sugar, oil, eggs and vanilla.
- Mix the dry ingredients in a separate bowl: flour, salt, cinnamon, baking powder, sodium bicarbonate and cocoa powder.
- Slowly fold the dry ingredients into the bean/avocado mixture until blended through.
- Spoon into small cupcake paper-lined bun trays. You should get about 20 small buns
- Bake for 15 minutes, until a knife inserted comes out clean. Be careful not to over-bake.
- Cool and enjoy with your kids!



Please note these buns are not low calorie or low fat, but the fats are heathier than those found in processed cakes. Most importantly the sugar content of each one is 12g (about 3tsp). You can even try to reduce the sugar further if you like! Each bun also gives your child 4g of protein and 1.5g fibre, which is not bad for a treat!

Outdoor Parties

If your family loves the outdoors, there are some great party options! **Stepping Stones Woodland Parties** in Belper, is run by two local mums with a creative flair and forest school training. Also check out **The Wildlife Trust** at Carsington Water or Matlock Bath & **Lea Green** (near Matlock) offering a range of outdoor activities. **Twistin' Tots** Music and Movement offer party packages for both in and outdoors.

Tips for Small Parties

There are some lovely options around if you want to keep your party small, for close friends and family.

- Both Cook Stars and Rachael's Secret Tea Room offer baking parties.
- Creation Station, Stepping Stones, Painting Parlour and Jumping Clay provide creative parties.
- Go Sensory offer Baby Sensory Parties, plus Slime Making, Science Workshops and Sparkly Parties for older children.
- Gary's Reptiles is a favourite among animal lovers.
- Unique Slumber Parties offer gorgeous personalised kit, including little indoor tents, perfect for a sleepover!
- Bounce Revolution trampoline park, offer party packages for your little jumping beans.
- For a small group of friends how about a trip out with either Birdswood Narrow
 Boat at the Cromford Canal or Ecclesbourne Valley Railway.

Tips for Big Parties

- If you invite the whole class, plus cousins and family friends, you may be catering for 30+ children, which requires lots of space. Hiring a venue could be a cheaper option (see the adjacent list of local venues).
- There are plenty of entertainers and soft play/ bouncy castle rentals to make the day memorable such as Skyeland Soft Play. Some entertainers like Mr Balloony offer entertainment that fits in with your theme.
- Scalextric On Tour can provide one of the largest digital Scalextrics layouts in the UK.
- If you'd rather have the ease of no set-up or clean up then Chucklebutties Soft Play in Belper offer party packages for different budgets. Déda in Derby offer dance parties and at BabyBallet Derbyshire Central you can choose from Disco, Ballerina, Super Hero and Fairy parties.

Tips for Parties on a Budget

- Halls can be hired from as little as £10 per hour. You can then arrange your own party games or a free disco, with a playlist from your phone.
- An even cheaper option is an outdoor gathering at a park or festival. One of my son's favourite birthday parties was at Crossley Park Splash Pad. The host laid out picnic blankets with a lovely spread and the kids ran about enjoying the park and water features.
- Garden parties and a treasure hunt is an easy and fun activity.
- If you are hosting a smaller party, you could have it inside your home and put out crafts.
- Parachute games always go down a treat and a parachute can be picked up for as little as £15.
- Derbyshire Toy Library
 offer toy hire including: small
 toys, ride-on toys and larger
 equipment like their undersea
 airflow tunnels. They also have
 bubble machines for hire.

7 TIPS FROM A PARTY EXPERT

I met with my friend and party expert Shelley Jenner-Dyer from Skyeland Soft Play. Here are her top tips for organising a party:

- **1**. Start by setting a budget. You'll be surprised how much the special touches add up.
- 2. Decide on a party theme. Skyeland offers ready-made packages, or you can create your very own. Shelley says their giant ball pool is a great hit with all ages!
- 3. Consider your venue. (Check that your venue allows bouncy castles.) Two hours seems to be about the best length of time for a party for young children,

but you may need to hire the venue for longer to set up and clear away.

- 4. Party bags delight children of all ages. Skyeland can provide these to save you time, but a helium balloon or sweetie cone can be just as exciting.
- 5. If you are catering the party yourself, do as much food prep as you can beforehand. Party food boxes are a great idea. You can pre-pack them for each child and pop in the fresh sandwiches just before you hand them out. You can even get themed ones!
- **6.** When counting up invitees, consider the possibility that

siblings may need to come along too. So extra food and party bags etc. may be needed.

7. Remember a party is a time to celebrate and catch up with family and friends, so relax, enjoy the moment and have fun!

What's Cooking? Apple Roses

Ingredients

125g puff pastry Itbsp apricot jam Itsp lemon juice I red apple Pinch of cinnamon

Icing sugar to dust over before serving

Instructions

- Cut a red apple into thin slices and put into a bowl.
 Cover with water and add the lemon juice. Heat in a microwave for 2-3 minuets to soften.
- Mix the apricot jam with a tablespoon of water in a small bowl
- 3) Cut the pre-rolled puff pastry into 3 equal strips and roll each strip slightly on a floured surface.
- Spread the jam mixture onto one of the strips and then lay out some of the apple slices onto the top half of the strip.
- 5) Sprinkle with a little bit of cinnamon, then fold up the bottom half of the pastry strip. Next roll up the pastry so it forms a 'rose'. Repeat for the other 2 pastry strips. Take each pastry roll and place it into a muffin tin.
- 1 6) Bake in the oven at 180C/gas mark 4 for 25 minutes.

What's Cooking? Sausage Bake

Ingredients

30g cooked pasta
2 tbsp tinned cannellini beans
4 cherry tomatoes
1/4 tsp dried oregano
5pring fresh rosemary
1/2 garlic clove
2 cooked sausages
1 tbsp olive oil

Instructions

- In a bowl, add the cooked pasta along with the cannellini beans.
- Halve the cherry tomatoes and place in the bowl along with the dried herbs and rosemary. Finely chop the garlic and add to the bowl.
- 3) Next add the cooked sausages and pour the balsamic vinegar and oil over the top.
- 5) Add salt and pepper and mix everything together well.
- 6) Place the tin (uncovered) into a preheated oven at 190C/160C Fan/gas mark 5 for around 20 minuets

IS PREGNANCY GOOD FOR YOUR BRAIN?

IT'S NOT 'MUMMY BRAIN' – IT'S MUMMY 'SUPERBRAIN', SOME EXPERTS NOW ARGUE.

The other day, I did the silliest thing...

Around 5pm, I walked to nursery to pick up my children as usual. When I got home, my car was gone from the driveway. I was stunned. Shaking from head to toe, I told the kids someone had taken our car without asking, and I called the police. 'And you say both sets of keys are still in the house?' the police officer asked. 'Wow, that's worrying.'

I got my crime number, then went to stare at our empty drive again. And a hazy memory came sneaking back. I'd driven somewhere earlier in the day, but weirdly, I remembered walking home. Oh no... could it be? My car hadn't been stolen, just forgotten.



When I told a friend later what I'd done, she replied: 'Oh dear, baby brain!'

I wondered, could she be right? The more I read about 'mumnesia', the more I doubted it. For one, I'm not pregnant: my baby is now two. Second, despite decades of research, science is stubbornly inconsistent as to whether pregnant women and new mums are more forgetful.

Two-thirds of women report having some kind of memory problems that they attribute to being pregnant, according to The Psychologist magazine. But for every scientific study that claims 'baby brain' is real, another will show it's not.

So, let's take a quick look at what we know about how pregnancy shapes our brains – you might be pleasantly surprised.

Pregnancy changes a woman's brain

In one way, baby brain is very real: pregnancy causes noticeable and long-lasting changes to parts of our brains.

In a study published by Nature Neuroscience in 2016, Dutch scientist Elseline Hoekzema and her team used MRI to compare the brains of 25 first-time mums with those of first-time fathers, and people without children. They found changes that lasted up to two years after the birth. The cause had to be pregnancy itself rather than the demands of parenting, they argued, as the same thing didn't happen to fathers.

Forgetfulness isn't a given

What isn't clear is whether these, and other brain changes that have been observed, explain why you sometimes find your keys in the fridge... or why I had to call the police again to tell them my car wasn't stolen, but was collecting parking fines outside our local café.

There have been loads of studies into whether motherhood turns your brain into a sieve, and no clear outcome. However in 2018, researchers at Deakin University in Australia looked through the evidence so far and concluded pregnant women might be more forgetful, but only when it came to remembering minor things. So maybe it was a matter of 'biological priming', argued associate professor Linda Byrne. 'Pregnant women have got more important concerns than minor memory lapses,' she argued. 'As pregnant women were required to focus, they behaved at normal levels of cognitive function.'

> Mummy rats get smarter

There's another problem with the idea of 'baby

brain' and it's this: much of what we know about how our brains change during pregnancy comes from studies in rats... and on the whole, pregnant rats are smart rats.

'Mother rats score higher in tests of attention, foraging

and planning than peers who have never given birth, writes psychology professor Laura Glynn in Scientific American Mind

So do we get stupider... or smarter?

You have to wonder, why would motherhood, with all its new experiences, make us anything other than smarter?

Going back to that Dutch research we looked at earlier, it seems clear our brains do adapt during pregnancy in order to care for a child. Their research found that areas of the cerebral cortex that are involved in empathy altered the most noticeably. Mothers who had the most dramatic changes bonded better with their babies later on.

But as for cognitive ability... well, the jury is still out.

Laura Glynn argues new mums are more forgetful and it's an unintended side-effect of all the other, more positive brain changes. 'Helpful adaptations are rarely achieved without an associated cost—and pregnancy brain may reflect just such a cost,' she writes. Others say it's a load of rot that mums forget stuff – we just believe it because, well, people tell us to.

Either way, next time you find a cold cup of tea in the fridge, take comfort. You might not actually be any sillier than you were before – and if you really, truly believe you are, it could just be because your brain is turning into a lean, mean mothering machine.

TREATING COLDS & FLU -

THE NATURAL WAY

Preventing and treating colds and the flu with essential oils and massage.

Using essential oils is an effective fragrant and easy way to prevent the spread of colds and flu and treat them if you do get ill. You don't need special or expensive equipment to use oils and they are widely available in supermarkets, health food shops and online.

> Sprinkling **lemon** essential oil on a tissue and stuffing it into the air vents in your car can help prevent the spread of germs on the school run. Not only is lemon anti-infectious, it's also uplifting and has antidepressant properties, perfect for Monday mornings, as the days get shorter and it gets harder to get out of bed.

Add a couple of drops each of lemon, tea tree and eucalyptus essential oils to a small dish with water and place it on a radiator for an instant and cheap oil diffuser! Let the oils fragrance your home and disinfect the air, which is much more beneficial and healthier (for you and the planet) than artificial home fragrances. Tea tree oil has antiseptic, antibacterial and immune stimulating properties. eucalyptus is a decongestant, expectorant and also an antimicrobial agent.

You can make your own version of a popular chest rub, without the petro-chemicals. Mix together eight drops of **cornmint** essential oil. which contains more menthol than peppermint. (although peppermint is still beneficial if you've got some left to use) with eight drops of eucalyptus oil and eight drops of rosemary oil with 25ml of sunflower oil. Massage into your chest or feet to clear your head and help you breathe more easily.

You could also use two drops each of commint, eucalyptus and rosemary in a bowl of hot water for inhalation. Cover your head with a towel to capture the steam and the essential oils as they evaporate whilst you breathe in Your sinuses will unblock in no time!

Using massage can also help to drain sinuses. Starting at the base of your neck, just above your collar bone, gently stroke downwards, working up towards your jaw inch by inch. Once you have cleared the way from your jaw down, you can use your fingers to slide from the corner of your nose. to the edge of your mouth and down to your jaw, repeating a few times. Next, starting on the inside corner of your eyes, circle with the pads of your fingers down to the corners of your nose. You'll probably feel (and hear!) the congestion starting to move at this point. Finally, circle the pads of your fingers from the inside of your eyebrows all the way along them to your cheekbones. It can be tender along this area, keep massaging until the tenderness has gone.

I'm dreaming of a GREEN CHRISTMAS! By Laura Lo Bue, Eco enthusiast and lover of all things natural

Instead of buying new decorations this Christmas, have fun with your kids creating your own using natural or recycled items. If you can get hold of some corks this year then why not try making a Wine cork reindeer!

What you'll need:

- Wine corks
- Small twigs
- Bits of left over ribbon, bells, string
- Mini red pompoms
- · Cork screw

You'll need two corks per reindeer.

How to make:

- 1. Take one cork and use your corkscrew to pierce four holes on one side
- **2.** Stick four little twigs in each hole for the legs.
- **3.** Then turn the cork over and pierce one hole on the top for the neck. Insert another twig in this hole.
- **4.** Take your second cork and pierce a hole on one side (this is where you insert the other end of the twig neck).
- 5. Pierce two more holes on the other side directly on top of the first single hole. Pop a twig in each hole for the antlers.
- **6.** Decorate your little reindeer by tying some ribbon or string and a bell around its neck and then stick on the reindeer's nose for the finishing touch.

On a final note, many of you will enjoy the beauty and festive smell of a real Christmas tree in your homes. Once taken down they are often squeezed into a bin or left at the bottom of the garden.

CHOOSING YOUR CHILDCARE



By Anna Isherwood, local mum of two and early education writer.

At some point many of us parents and carers will face the dilemma of what type of childcare we would like for our little people.

My eldest daughter attended a day nursery, full-time. We had just moved to Belper and our friends and family (all of our support network) were nearly four hours away. Both my husband and I travelled a lot with our jobs so we needed childcare which was provided all day and open throughout the year. With our second daughter our circumstances had changed. I had given up

work but knew I wanted her to have some time to interact with other children and get used to other adults, so we opted for a preschool environment, starting the term after her 2nd birthday.

There are many childcare options out there and we are very lucky to have so many fabulous childcare settings right on our doorstep. This article is intended to help you make your choice, but remember you can also have a mix of environments for your child, if you should wish.

The National Childbirth Trust (NCT) suggests a number of questions that parents and carers should consider when deciding on a childcare setting.

These questions include where you would like your child to be cared for and how this will fit around your work schedule and work location and also what will happen on holidays. There are overt and hidden costs to consider as well as funding and financial support. For more information visit: www.nct.org.uk/parenting/childcare-options.

There are several ways that you can reduce the cost of childcare. Please see: www.childcarechoices.gov.uk for more information.

Two Year Olds

If your child is two or nearly two you might qualify for free childcare worth up to 570 hours per year of early education funding. The funding would start the term after your child turns two. Please note that this is subject to meeting certain criteria, for example if you receive certain benefits. You can apply online, by text or by phone.

Three & Four Year Olds

All three and four year olds are now entitled up to 15 hours a week of free early years education. Some families can receive up to 30 hours of funded childcare a week. Apply for funding via: www.gov.uk/help-with-childcare-costs/free-childcare-and-education-for-2-to-4-year-olds.

Tax-Free Childcare

You can get up to £500 every three months for each of your children to help with the costs of childcare. The government will pay £1 for every £4 you pay to your childcare provider via an online account. To see if you and your childcare settings are eligible, please check the website: www.gov.uk/help-with-childcare-costs/tax-free-childcare.

Child Tax Credit

This is for parents or carers with children 16 or vounger. or children under 20 who are in education or training Please see www.gov.uk/child-taxcredit for more information

Working Tax Credit

Universal Credit





Starting **School**

The facts you need to know.

If your child was born between 1st September 2014 and 31 August 2015 you should apply for their school place by 15 January 2019. Decisions will be notified on 16th April 2019, Primary National Offer Day. They will be eligible to start school in September 2019.

You will fill in one application form

www.derbyshire.gov.uk/admissions – either online or by phone – stating up to three preferences in priority order for any primary or infant school. There has been a recent change to the method of measuring home to school distance for admissions purposes. A straight line distance from home to school replaces the shortest available route

Catholic primary schools give preference in their admissions arrangements to Catholic children, however applications are very welcome from all parents and carers, regardless of faith or background. who'd like their children to be educated in a Christian environment

Delaying when your child starts primary school

You have the right to defer admission but not beyond the point at which the child reaches compulsory school age (5 years old). You can also request that your child attends part-time until they reach compulsory school age. If your child is summer born (i.e. born between the beginning of April and end of August) and you do not take up a reception place in the academic year and choose to make an application for the following September, the application will normally be considered for admission into year 1. Exceptionally, if your child is summer born and you do not feel they are ready for school you can request that they enter reception class in the September after their fifth birthday. If you wish to make a formal request you should contact the Admissions and Transport Team for a copy of the Council's policy on the admission of children outside of their normal age group by emailing admissions.transport@derbyshire.gov.uk or call 01629 537479. Each case is considered individually and there is no guarantee your request will be accepted.

Visiting potential schools

You can access school websites and Ofsted Reports online, but it is recommended that you visit the schools you are considering to get a feel for the environment, class sizes and ethos to help you best decide which suits your child and their needs. Call up the schools you wish to visit around mid-September and arrange a tour. These usually take place October time, sometimes as a guided tour with other parents or individually. It is recommended you take your child with you.






