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PRIDE IN MY FAMILY

There are many things I love about being gay, my wife (obviously), the fact that I feel a part of a very special LGBTQ+ family and the fact that we were able to get married three times (yes three times!!!). The first time, we were

civil partnered. Imagine my joy when I bounced up to the registry office

in a pretty dress announcing we were there to get married only to be told, in no uncertain terms that we were not, we were there to be 'civil partnered'

thank you very much! The second time, we both wore beautiful wedding dresses and had an awesome handfasting ceremony and finally, two years later we upgraded to full marriage status and wore tuxedo's.... because we'd done every other outfit.

I feel incredibly lucky to be gay in this time and in this country, but I'm still acutely aware that there are places I can't or won't go on holiday; I've always wanted to go to Russia but I'm not sure we'd be very welcome at the moment. Even in European countries I have to be careful about how affectionate I am with my wife and I've not even yet considered how I will take my wife and kids abroad, not knowing how other countries will react to our family.

Families are a bit like chips. We

come in all shapes and sizes these days and, just like chips, there is a diverse range. My family is one of the newer shapes. My wife and I adopted our two children over three years ago. You'd be hard pushed to find a gay couple who have kids by accident. 'It's something to do with biology', as our

doctor told us when we went to him to say we were struggling to conceive (we really did do this but it was a bit more of a joke). With the help of our doctors I did try a couple of rounds of donor insemination (it really is as sexy as it sounds!) but the hormones made me into a crazy lady. My wife, Sadie, couldn't conceive because she broke her back when she was younger.

We knew we wanted a family and whilst babies are nice, family is forever, so we adopted. It's a long and tricky process but where else do you get parent training, where else do you get so much support in becoming a parent that you don't feel totally on your own?! Don't get me wrong, when you bring two kids home, shut the door and go, 'Right, so we're a family now!' you still stare at each other in disbelief and think, 'Crickey, what do we do now?!'

One of the dilemmas we faced was what parent names do we use? We didn't both want to be 'Mummy' so eventually we went for 'Mummy and Mopsy', which takes some explaining; it evolved from the idea of Pops, to Mops, to Mopsy! I love that if we need help, we can ring Coram, the adoption agency we used. I love that my wife and I now have two beautiful, funny (so funny!!), and kind (mostly) and gorgeously infuriating kids and do you know what? Three years on, we are a family. We love, we support, we argue, we do everything a family does, and that is all I could have ever asked for!





PRIDE IN BELPER

This summer Belper will host its first ever Pride in Belper festival on August 3rd. Pride in Belper seeks to celebrate people of all ages, abilities, cultures and identities, all of whom make up this wonderful community. It has grown from a family

friendly picnic in the Memorial Gardens to a big, bold family-focused celebration throughout town.

Pride events are held all over the world and are a celebration of diversity and inclusivity within communities. Pride is important for families because it celebrates everything that a family represents — love, difference, safety and history. Pride stands against the discrimination and invisibility that some families and some people face; it says boldly and loudly, "we see you - you are not invisible - you matter". People of all ages, role models and allies are important because everyone needs to know that however they identify, someone is on their side.

We are lucky to live in a country where there are laws that respect and protect each person's freedoms. The reality of what makes a family has changed over the years, and is no longer defined as the archetypal husband, wife and 2.4 children. In 2019 we know that the definition of a family does not depend on gender, it depends on who you love and how you love each other. From 2020 the National Curriculum will include relationship education in primary schools, which will be broadened to relationship and sex education in secondary schools. Relationship education will include respect for people who identify as lesbian, gay and bi-sexual, as well as all gender identities. It will also cover relationship recognition and protections that the Equality Act

(2010) affords people and families who identify as LGBT+.

People of all ages need to know that difference is okay and normal, however they also need to see this in their communities. Pride in Belper is not about identifying difference in order to consciously be inclusive, it is about respecting the fact that we are all human and therefore we all have the same right to be respected, feel safe and be celebrated. Pride in Belper is a huge celebration of people, however we identify.

This year marks the 50th anniversary of the Stonewall riots and the 30th anniversary of the organisation and human rights charity. Stonewall began in 1989 to challenge the discrimination of LGBT+ families through Section 28. Section 28, prevented schools from talking about difference in family make-up and identity, leaving children who did not identify as heterosexual with a profound belief that there was something wrong with them. The fear this created amongst teachers and schools and the damage this did to thousands of children and young people is immeasurable. Echoes of this have been seen in Birmingham schools this year, with the protests against the No Outsiders (learning about difference in our communities) programme. However, the stand against this discrimination has been profound and very public. This year the Government voted to include inclusive relationship education in the National Curriculum from 2020. Today we stand of the shoulders of those people who have gone before us when we challenge discrimination and celebrate our Pride in Belper.



Accessible Belper

One in five people has a disabling condition. Accessible Belper aims to ensure that accessibility for all is an automatic practice throughout the town. They continually research the needs of our community and examples of their work include training and partnering with Alzheimer's UK and Belper School, highlighting the lack of toilets and raising funds to provide a Mobiloo at events. They organised a Dementia 'Song and Dance day', increased Accessible taxis, and organised Slow Shopping at the Food Festivals. They also provide accessibility advice to the shops and businesses in Belper. Siobhan Fennell, the Chair of Accessible Belper, has been named on the Queen's Birthday Honour list and will receive a British Empire Medal for services to transport accessibility, inclusion and disability awareness.

Derwent valley cycleways


Want somewhere safe and beautiful to ride your bikes? Without loading them into the car first!

SO PROUD OF BELPER'S HERITAGE

We're so lucky in Belper - not only is it a fantastic place to live, it's also full of history and heritage. Some of it so important that the town is part of the Derwent Valley Mills World Heritage Site.

There's a whole host of fascinating stories about the town, and the wider Derwent Valley, but we asked some of the people who work with our local heritage, what aspects make them most proud of Belper's contribution to world history.

> Kat Tonks is the new manager at Strutt's North Mill, Belper's own museum. She says: "I'm a new arrival in Belper, but I'm already very proud of the North Mill and its amazing history! The skyscraper technology

developed in its construction really is something to be proud of, as is the museum we have here today. The volunteers work so hard to make it a wonderful place to visit, they have so many stories to tell, to all ages!"

> Mary Smedley is the chairman of Belper Historical Society, and the original manager of Strutt's North Mill. She says: "Belper really was an industrial giant at one stage, not just with its mills but also its nail-makers, its

foundries, hosiery producers and more. Wonderfully, as the industry went, Belper re-invented itself as the vibrant and friendly town it is today. We have so much history to celebrate and be proud of, but it's the hard work of its industrial pioneers, the people who worked for them, as well as those who re-energised it after the loss of industry, that made the town what it is today."

Adrian Farmer has written a number of books about Belper's history, and is a co-ordinator for the **Derwent Valley Mills** World Heritage Site, which includes Belper and its mills. He says: "One of the most wonderful

things about Belper, and the wider Derwent Valley, is that despite all that industrial development since the 18th century, you can still enjoy a sense of the rural landscape in which our mills, factories and workers' houses were placed. It's still a green and beautiful valley and the contrast with such important historic industrial buildings makes for a landscape which is like no other. That really is something to be proud of!"

lan Jackson is one of the World Heritage Site's researchers and walk leaders, and specialisies in how water-power provided for all the historic mills. He says: "The Strutt family truly were engineering pioneers particularly William Strutt, who

designed the North Mill. One of the most amazing things about the Belper Mills site is the network of water channels, the magnificent horseshow weir, and the system that was set up to ensure there was always plenty of power to work the machinery to provide good cotton thread. That energy was clean, carbon-free and re-usable. The Strutts were ahead of the game in so many ways, and what they achieved in Belper so long ago is as relevant now as it ever was - there's something to make us all proud." **Doom** 23

SUMMER WATER FUN

Fingers crossed for some lovely summer holiday weather here in Britain. No doubt you'll be looking for outdoor activities on those hotter days. Here are some ideas for where you can head for water fun on those days when the kids need a cool down. Most of them are FREE, after the cost of parking...

SPLASH PADS & PADDLING POOLS

Crossley Park in Ripley has a great splash pad that's enclosed with a grassy area and picnic benches. There is a car park next to the park and a good playground. There are no refreshments for sale but there are toilets with limited opening times.

Hall Leys Park in Matlock has a splash pool next to a play area and little boating lake. You can hire boats for a small cost. There is a café and toilets in the park too. Car parks do get quite full in Matlock, so you may wish to catch the train, which delivers you near the park.

Heanor Memorial Park Spray Pool (next to the Heanor Leisure Centre) has just been refurbished and has an area for toddlers and an area for older children. There is a great Snack Shack within the enclosure and toilets nearby.

Markeaton Park has a very large paddling pool with fountains, near several big play grounds. It's lots of fun but very busy and it's difficult to keep little ones in view.



Bakewell Recreation Ground has a small splash pad as does Chaddesden Park.

We recommend you check the park or council websites ahead of your visit to ensure the splash pads are working and to make note of days and times they are switched on.

OUTDOOR SWIMMING POOLS

Hathersage is a 30m outdoor heated swimming pool (28 degrees) with changing cubicles and a pool cafe. There is a cost to enter and you will need to check the website for the session timetable (www.

Playing by water is fun, but **extra** safety precautions must be taken. We asked Derbyshire Fire & Rescue Service for their top tips for Water Safety.

Station Manager Kevin Page said:

- When the weather's hot, and in particular during the school holidays, increasing numbers of children put themselves at risk of drowning. Open water such as rivers, lakes and reservoirs can look inviting, but there are many hidden dangers associated with them. 9 9
- Swimming in a warm swimming pool is very different to swimming in cold open water. Hidden currents, deep water and hidden rubbish all present a risk of drowning, not to mention the cold water shock that can lead to muscle cramps and difficulty breathing. 99

We want everyone to stay safe this summer, whether it be small children enjoying a summer's day paddling at a splash pool, or a group of teenagers looking for a place to cool down. We would therefore like to remind parents and children to only swim in swimming pools where a lifeguard is present and to only allow children to play in splash pools under close supervision. 9 9

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
RECIPE FOR GREEN EGGS

"I will not eat" is a common thing we hear as parents. Cooking for young and fussy children can be a nightmare! On top of that there is so much information out there about things we should, or should not be feeding our kids. It is a minefield, but you can find peace at your dinner table. Making meals playful and silly can reduce the stress and help children learn to enjoy food.

Children love the book "Green Eggs and Ham" by Dr Suess. It's a lengthy, repetitive ode to picky eating, which ends in the central character finally trying a food he finds disgusting - green eggs and ham.

I've devised a recipe for green eggs, that's healthy and kidapproved! Parents love this recipe, because it packs in loads of nutritious spinach (high in several vitamins and minerals). Kids enjoy it, because it's from a familiar, well-loved book.





BASIC INGREDIENTS (SERVES 4-8)

I Tbsp butter

100g washed baby leaf spinach

4 spring onions, sliced

100g grated cheese

9 eggs

METHOD

- I Melt the butter in an oven-proof frying pan over medium heat and add the spring onions. Sauté for a few minutes.
- 2 Crack the eggs into a bowl and add the spinach then blend until smooth with a stick blender or food processor. After you've tried this recipe a few times you can start to add more spinach to make the eggs more healthy... and more green!
 - 3 Add the green egg mixture to the frying pan and stir and cook for a few minutes, then spread flat. Cook over medium heat until the eggs are mostly solid, taking care not to burn the bottom.
 - 4 Spread the top with cheese and grill in the oven until golden brown.
 - 5 Cool slightly and cut into slices like a pie and serve with pasta, rice, toast or a jacket potato to make it a complete meal.
